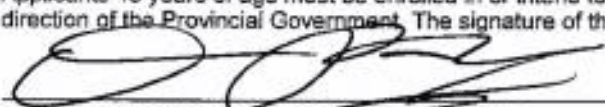

STEP 1: Obtain an SGI Customer Number

Before students can enrol in the class, they must set up their Personal Profile and obtain their Personal ID number to do online testing. Visit any SGI agency to obtain this. Take two pieces of original identification to establish your full legal name, birthdate, and signature (e.g. Canadian Birth Certificate/ Canadian Passport/Treaty card) - (immigration papers or permanent residency papers must be provided as well when using a foreign birth certificate or passport). If they have an SGI Photo Card, they already have their ID number so will not have to visit an SGI agency.

You will be given your Personal Identification Document. **Do not lose this.** Also, fill this eight-digit number in **Section D** of the attached SGI Signature Form and **complete Section A**. *Section B will be completed by the driver instructor at the end of your in-class hours.*

This Signature form **MUST BE** completed and returned with the application to the main office or the student **WILL NOT** be eligible to enroll in the class.

STEP 2: Register for MySGI CLASSIC

- Make sure you have added **your own personal email** (not your parent or guardian's email) address to your customer file. An activation code will automatically be sent to student email account. You will use this code to set up your MySGI CLASSIC account.
- Register for a secure online account by going to www.sgi.sk.ca/online and select the **Register Button**.

The following steps must be completed to sign on to MySGI account.

- Select ***I have an activation code***
- Select **Submit**
- Provide the information required along with your activation code, which should be sent to the student's personal cell phone, then select the **Submit Button**
- Create a username and password and **Submit**
- Review and accept Terms of Use
- Welcome to MySGI CLASSIC! You should now be able to log on to your own personal SGI account with your personal profile page.
- *You must remember your password for exam day.*

Learners' Licensing Changes:

Effective immediately, SGI is changing the way novice drivers can acquire a learner's license. A 15 year old students can now get a learner's license as soon as they are enrolled in a current or future High School Driver Education Program (bringing their completed forms to the office).

The Learner stage is one of the safest stages for new drivers because they are under the guidance of an experienced supervising driver. With this change, learners have the opportunity to get more supervised practice time behind the wheel (12 months rather than 9 months). Practice is essential for developing a safe driver and ensuring the learner is prepared for their road test.

Previously, a 15 year old would have to wait until they were actively taking their High School Driver Education Program to be eligible for a learner's license. Due to course scheduling and the demand for driver training, there were times when students couldn't get into a class until well into their 15th year, meaning they couldn't get their driver's license until well into their 16th year. Now, they only need to be enrolled in the program to be eligible for a learner's license. Once enrolled, they may immediately visit an SGI testing office to write the learner's test and validate a learner's license at their own cost (\$25.00).

Students will still have to complete the full driver education course (30 hours in class and 6 hours in car) before becoming eligible to take their road test once they turn 16. This change simply allows 15 year old drivers a chance to begin accumulating supervised driving experience without delay. Should the 15 year old learner become unenrolled in the class, then their learner's license is cancelled.
