1800 Wheelchair (2 X \$500)

Open to all students. Students must write a poem, in a style of your choosing, on the theme of overcoming a personal challenge.

A Voice for Animals Contest (multiple awards)

Students who have a passion for animal rights are encouraged to look at the criteria for this contest.

Aboriginal Arts & Stories (\$500- \$2000)

Create a writing or art piece that explores a moment or theme in Aboriginal history or culture. A 200-400 word Artist's or Author's Statement that explains how your piece reflects or interprets the moment or theme you selected must accompany your entry into the Aboriginal Arts & Stories competition.

Affinity Credit Union (Elwood Harvey Scholarship) (2 x \$2500)

This is a scholarship available for students in grade 11. Chosen applicants are selected based on academics, as well as school and community involvement.

Agriculture Student Scholarship (\$4000 or \$2000)

Saskatchewan Grade 12 students and recent high school graduates (within the last two years) have the chance to win a grand-prize scholarship of \$4,000 or one of three runner-up scholarships of \$2,000 when they submit a three-minute video or 1,000-word essay on transparency. This year's scholarship theme encourages youths to explore their idea of transparency in agriculture and how it affects public perception of the industry.

To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants must be planning to take an agriculture-related post-secondary education program beginning in the fall of 2022. This scholarship program has been designed to identify young people who are planning to pursue a career in the agriculture industry.

AIA and the University of the Aftermarket Foundation Scholarship (\$1000)

Selected candidates receive a \$1,000 scholarship. While all students are encouraged to apply, priority in awarding scholarships will be given to those pursuing a career in the automotive aftermarket. As a bonus, a matching grant is awarded to scholarship recipients who become technicians in the automotive aftermarket. You may claim your matching grant up to one year after graduation. Please note: Students must be enrolled full-time for the year of the scholarship. For instance, if you apply this year, you must be enrolled for the academic year starting September of this year up to May or June of the following year.

Albert Park Community Association (3 X \$750)

The APCA is offering a scholarship to a Grade 12 student who plans on attending a post-secondary institution, actively participates in community activities and volunteers in their community. Need to live in Albert Park.

Apprenticeship Completion Grant

Registered apprentices who have completed their training and become a certified journeyperson in a designated Red Seal trade and who either the Red Seal endorsement or a provincial or territorial Certificate of Qualification can apply for the [Apprenticeship Completion Grant \(ACG\)](#), which is a taxable cash grant of \$2000.00.

Apprenticeship Incentive Grant

Registered apprentices who have successfully finished their first or second year/level (or equivalent) in one of the Red Seal trades can apply for the [Apprenticeship Incentive Grant \(AIG\)](#), which is a taxable cash grant of \$1000.00 per year/level up to a maximum of \$2000.00.

Apprenticeship Incentive Grant For Women

In Budget 2018, the Government of Canada announced a new [Apprenticeship Incentive Grant for Women](#) to further support women in entering, progressing, and completing their training in Red Seal trades where women are underrepresented. The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant for Women (AIG-W) is a taxable cash grant of \$3,000 per year/level (or equivalent) up to a maximum amount of \$6,000 per person.

Assignment Saving Lives Bursary Program (Awards up to \$1250)

How does the program work?

We are asking students to recruit 15 blood donors who will donate at any of our blood donation events in Canada from April 1 to June 30. Participants who are successful in recruiting 15 or more donors who have attended their appointments during the program timeframe, have a chance to win a bursary of up to \$1250 to be applied towards post-secondary tuition fees for those who are enrolled no later than January 31, 2022. Participants will gain hands-on experience, developing leadership, project management and communication skills. Registration is open until May 31. Recruitment period closes June 30.

ATCO Indigenous Education Awards Program (\$500-\$1500)

Awards are presented to select Indigenous students (**Merit** - \$500 for students completing Grades 10-12, including upgrading; **Bursary** - \$1000 for students registered in a trade, community, or technical college diploma program; **Scholarship** - \$1500 for university or graduate degree students) who demonstrate leadership capabilities and commitment in their quest for higher education. To be considered for an award, students must complete the [online application form](#), and submit the required documentation, including reference letter, proof of enrollment for upcoming school semester, short essay (500-1000 words) describing why you are a suitable candidate, and recent school transcript.

Automotive Industries of Association of Canada

Scholarships are awarded to female, North American citizens, with a passion for a career or advancement in the automotive and its related industries. To be eligible for a scholarship, applicants should be already accepted to or enrolled in an accredited collegiate program, with a 3.0 or higher GPA and a citizen within North America. Burger King Scholars Program

In memory of Burger King co-founder James W. McLamore. Scholarship grants range from \$1,000 to \$50,000, and are intended to help students offset the cost of attending college or post-secondary vocational/technical school. Recipients are selected based on their grade point average, work experience, extracurricular activities and/or community service.

CAA Saskatchewan (3 X \$2500)

CAA Saskatchewan awards three annual entrance scholarships of \$2,500 each to students attending the province's major post-secondary educational facilities - University of Saskatchewan, University of Regina and SIAST. Applicants must be either a CAA Saskatchewan Member or child of a Member, and a resident of Saskatchewan. CAA Saskatchewan also awards one entrance scholarship of \$2,500 to an employee or child of an employee. The successful candidate is determined by academic excellence and selected by CAA Saskatchewan.

Canadian Engineering Memorial Foundation Scholarships

Canadian Federation of Independent Grocers

CFIG offers a variety of scholarships to current CFIG member (retail, associate, affiliate) or be a family member of an employee of a current CFIG member. A 1000 word essay is required based on the following topic: Given all of the consolidation that has taken place in the grocery industry, what are some of the strategic changes the independent or franchised grocer will need to implement to remain successful?

Canadian Hearing Services Scholarship

Canadian Hearing Services proudly offers scholarships to Deaf and hard of hearing students to help break down barriers to higher education and build brighter futures.

Scholarships of \$3,000 a year for full-time students and \$1,000 a year for part-time students are awarded to top qualified candidates who are pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited institution, inside or outside of Canada. Once secured, students may receive an annual award for up to four years. Awards may cover tuition, residence or educational resources. The exact number of awards will be dependent on the number and ranking of qualified applicants.

Canadian Hospitality Foundation

The Canadian Hospitality Industry offers over \$200,000 in scholarships for students wishing to pursue a career in the hospitality, foodservice and tourism industry across Canada annually.

Canadian Merit Scholarship Foundation (Loran Award)

Awarded to talented young Canadians on the basis of character, service and leadership potential. Canadian Society of Exploration Geophysicists

The student must be pursuing a course of studies directed toward a career in exploration geophysics or be a dependent of a CSEG member who will be entering university. In order to qualify for an award, students must be enrolled at a Canadian university in an academic program leading to an exploration geophysics career in industry, teaching or research. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic performance, financial need, interest in geophysics and extra-curricular activities.

Canadian Welding Association

The CWA Foundation Secondary School Awards program was founded in 2014 for the purposes of promoting and encouraging the pursuit of post-secondary education in welding. The awards are for students who show an aptitude and passion for the welding industry and/or financial need, and are applying to a certified welding program offered by a publically funded Canadian College or University.

Catholic Women's League of Canada – Social Justice Award (\$1000)

This award is open to Grade 12 females who demonstrate involvement in social justice activities. Recommendation of a pastor is required. Award must be used to finance participation in a social justice activity either locally or abroad. Priority will be given to CWL members or relatives of CWL members. This is a yearly award that may be given to the same candidate repeatedly over the course of 10 years, or distributed among several applicants. Academic standing and background will be a consideration but not the determining factor.

Conexus Youth Leadership Awards (30 X \$500)

\$1,000 bursary to a qualifying First Nation/Metis student enrolled in the University of Regina, UR Accelerated Program. The intent of this bursary is to support and encourage an individual who has ambition, determination and a vision for their career. DynalIndustrial's hope is that this bursary will provide someone an opportunity to do something that they may not have had the chance to do otherwise.

This bursary will be presented to a self-declared First Nation/Metis student enrolled in the University of Regina UR Accelerated Program. The chosen recipient will display perseverance and diligence as a student. The student must be caring, generous, responsible, and involved in their community.

Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation (\$15,000)

This foundation supports students who are in the early stages of pursuing their career as an artist. Applicants must be 18 years of age.

Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria Scholarships (Several @ \$1500)

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council awards Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria (Canada) Scholarships annually. The number of scholarships awarded is determined by the earnings of the scholarship trust.

An applicant must be:

- A Canadian student entering freshman year of an undergraduate program leading to a baccalaureate degree at a college or university in Canada.
- A member in good standing in a Canadian council of the Knights of Columbus, or the son or daughter of such a member or deceased member. (Not limited to Fourth Degree members.)

Each scholarship of \$1,500 is awarded on the basis of academic excellence and is renewable each year of study, pending satisfactory academic performance, to a total of four years.

Gerry McCudden Memorial Scholarship Award (\$2000)

This scholarship is open to RCSD Grade 12s who have an average of 80% or higher in their Grade 12 year. Leadership potential and/or participation in leadership roles in school or community is necessary. See Student Services for the Personal Essay prompt (500 word essay required). Students must be accepted into a post-secondary institution for the fall.

Girl Guides of Canada (\$1000-\$2000)

The National Scholarship Program is one of the ways that [Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada \(GGC\)](#) recognizes girls and adult Members who embody the Mission and Values of the organization. This program supports “registered Members” who continue in Guiding, while they pursue their education / training at a recognized post-secondary institution. More than 25 awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,000. The number of scholarships awarded varies from year to year.

Girls Impact the World Scholarship Awards (\$5000)

The ConnectHER Film Festival is an international youth competition that welcomes short films about issues that impact women and girls. Before making a film for submission, please read all of the following entry requirements:

A) Films must focus on one of our topic areas. Categories include global girls' education, women and work, ending violence against women, women refugees, women's global health issues, women and the environment, women, and girls in tech, and redefining beauty.

B) We accept every type of filmmaking form and style; whether animation or live-action, documentary or narrative.

C) Filmmakers must be 13 to 25 years old at the submission date. That means that scripts, storyboards, directing, cinematography, editing, etc., must be done by people who meet this age requirement. Actors can be any age.

D) Films must be original works that have not yet been screened at other major film festivals.

E) Films must have been completed after January 1.

F) Films must be 3 to 6 minutes long.

G) Film file formats accepted are .mov and .mp4. HD resolution and optimized sound quality are highly preferred. Digital submission

through Google Drive is preferred, but WeTransfer or Dropbox also works.

H) All films must be subtitled in English.

I) Films must be submitted by the deadline to qualify. No late submissions will be accepted.

J) If your film contains any graphic content, include a warning near the beginning of the film. ConnectHER has full discretion about accepting films, particularly in instances where film submissions contain nudity, profanity, violence, or sexually explicit content.

K) PowerPoints will not be accepted. Films must have some cinematic value.
